



# Making Organza bags filled with Scented Aroma Beads

**You will need:**

- 1 oz Aroma beads
- 4 ml of Essential Oil
- Glass Jar with a tightly fitting lid
- 1-3 Organza Bags 3" x 4"
- Liquid Candle Coloring dye (optional)



To begin, Take your empty jar and pour in the bottle of essential oils.

If you want to have colored Aroma Beads this is when you would add a few drops of Liquid Candle Dye. You CANNOT use Food Color or water based dyes as they will not work. The beads will not absorb the essential oils and will not become dry.

Here I have added several drops of our Pink/red Liquid Candle coloring Dye and also some of the Blue. I swirled the glass jar to mix the colors to give me a nice light lavender color.

Since I'm using Lavender Essential oil it will compliment the scent!



Next you'll Simply place the aroma beads in the jar. Place the lid on the jar and tighten the cap.

Once you have tightened the jar lid and shaken the container, I do not recommend opening the jar again until you are ready to fill your organza bags.

You should shake the tightly capped jar occasionally over the next few hours.



Now you have to be a little patient. It will usually take about 24 hours for the essential oils to soak completely into the aroma beads.

Although with some essential oils it may take 48 hours or longer. And in some cases – they may be ready in just a couple hours. Each essential oil or blend is different.

You will know when your aroma beads are ready when they 'look' dry, no longer cling to the side of the jar and feel dry to the touch.

Once they are ready, You might want to pour your beads into a shallow bowl. It will make it easier for you to 'spoon' them into your organza bags.



Depending on how full you want your bags to be 1 ounce of scented beads can fill one organza bag. But for the best use of your scented beads it is better to partially fill 2 or 3 organza bags.

Since Aroma beads do not freshen the air like regular heated type candles or potpourris. You need to have 'air flow' around the beads to help the scent penetrate into the room.

This is important to remember when filling your organza bags. A tablespoon or two in each bag will produce scenting longer than if you pack the bag tightly.

You can refresh the scent by placing the aroma beads back into a jar and adding more essential oils. You can usually do this a couple times before the beads will no longer take the scent.

When you are not using your scented aroma bead organza filled bags, store them in a tightly covered Glass jar.

If you are giving for gifts, place them in a re-sealable zip bag.
